Economic recovery impacts will continue for some time, with requirements for:

- Higher productivity
 - Unemployment continues to rise in major regions through 2H 2010
 - In U.S. alone, job reductions since 2008 eliminated job growth over the last five years
 - Previous recession...took 55 months for employment to recover to pre-recession levels



- The largest enterprises are most focused on cost reductions in their imaging/printing environment
 - Almost 60% of large enterprises but 45% of mid-size have initiatives in place
 - Focus of initiatives is changing
 - From hardware focus to document workflows (paper and digital)






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Cost-Effective Imaging/Printing

Economic recovery impacts will continue for some time:

- Mobile/remote workforce expansion requires IT infrastructure/support, and corporate data needs to be protected
 - 29% of WW workforce in 2008 is mobile; 35% in 2013
 - Largest group is mobile office worker (60% share, 5% growth); fastest growth in home-based (6% CAGR, 5% share)
- Government economic stimulus and regulations require cost cutting and streamlined, secure document workflows in
 - Hard hit verticals (e.g. Financial Services, Automotive Manufacturing) needing to cut costs
 - Government agencies involved in stimulus need to streamline workflows
 - Healthcare. \$20B earmarked in the U.S. for EMR and Health Information Exchange will begin to be available in 2010. IDC predicts 2010 as the year of the EMR.
 - Increased regulations require streamlined and secure document workflows








IT infrastructure trends

- Web and the Cloud enable access anywhere, anytime, and increase security risks
 - Mobile devices proliferation
 - Smartphones, smartbooks, netbooks, tablets, laptops, e-readers
 - Smart MFPs are clients too, with direct access to the web and network resources



- More and more focus on the business-value of IT investments
- Increases need to outsource to best-in-class providers







Environmental sustainability

- Reduce carbon footprint in the printing ecosystem from manufacturing through usage and disposal
 - Hardcopy devices
 - Ink/toner cartridges
 - Paper
 - Document storage
- Calls for
 - Print policies and governance
 - Network print management software and controls (driver management, color controls, etc.)

Managed Print Services in 2010 and Beyond

- Contracts must have pro-active management and on-going optimization of the printing and imaging environment for continuous cost reductions and productivity improvements.
- They do so by evolving the contract focus beyond device consolidation
 - From hardcopy infrastructure to business-critical document workflows (paper and digital)
 - From office to data center and beyond
 - Remote employees, print procurement
 - From local to global
 - From sustainability in imaging/printing to a balance with proliferating client devices







 - Streamlined business process document workflows has increased in importance

Help desk calls, paper document storage and impact on the environment.

Managed Print Services – Driving Better Business Outcomes



Better business outcomes by streamlining businesscritical document workflows (horizontal)

- Knowledge/general office worker documents created and/or managed by in distributed office environments
- Purchasing, billing, invoicing, expense report, check processing, account statement documentation and similar types of documents
- Human resources documentation such as job applications/resumes, 401k applications, health plan applications (e.g. medical, dental, vision), benefits forms (pre-tax spending, changes forms), personnel changes, hiring/termination forms, government documents (e.g. I-9, W-2)
- Marketing documents such as flyers/brochures, newsletters, ad or packaging mockups/comps, direct mail
- Legal documents such as contracts, litigation support, wills, real estate deeds, automobile title/registration
- Regulatory and Compliance documents such as disclosure documents, SEC filings, pharma drug submission documents, stock trade documents, health care privacy disclosure, lending institution disclosure

Managed Print Services – Driving Better Business Outcomes



Better business outcomes by streamlining businesscritical document workflows (vertical industry-specific)

- Manufacturing documents such as shipping, inventory management, purchase orders, CAD drawings and other such documentation
- **Medical documents** (excluding imaging) such as patient records, patient admission forms, test results, doctor/nurse orders/notes
- **Financial applications** such as credit cards, mortgages, other loans, new brokerage accounts, or retirement accounts etc.
- **Insurance documents** such as claims, medical history, fraud investigation, new account applications, change forms, etc.
- **Education documents** such as transcripts processing, individual education plans
- Government documents such as benefit forms processing, secure identity records processing/management

Streamlining Document Workflows



Key Processes Undergoing Paper-to-Digital Conversion, By Vertical Industry

Healthcare:

- Medical documents (patient records, admission forms, test results, dr./nurse orders/notes, etc. but excl. X-rays),
- Insurance documents (claims, medical history, fraud investigation, new account applications, change forms, etc.)
- Financial: credit cards, new account openings, mortgages, loans, etc.
- Manufacturing: shipping, inventory management, purchase orders, CAD, etc), drawings/designs.
- Retail/Wholesale: marketing documents (e.g. flyers/brochures, newsletters, ad or packaging mock-ups/comps, direct mail)
- Services: knowledge/general office worker
- Education: knowledge/general office worker, HR
- Government: HR, knowledge/general office worker, regulatory/compliance

Streamlining Document Workflows – Paper-to-Digital Conversion Methods



Three methods lead among the five we examined (43-62% mentions)

The leaders are:

- On-line forms replacing paper forms
- Scanned documents archived in electronic format
- Scanned documents integrated into an electronic business process workflow

Other processes trail (26-30% mentions)

The other processes are:


- Electronic faxes integrated into electronic business process workflow
- Customer transactions and communications moved to web site

Note: IDC identified variations in the above by business process (e.g. medical processes, financial, etc.)

Streamlining Document Workflows -Vertical Industries Leading The Charge



(% end users reporting paper-to-digital workflow adoption)



- Yes, co. has
- No, not dept. nor co.

Example of how to read this chart: For the Finance Vertical, 50% of end users in the Finance vertical report paper-to-digital workflow adoption at a co.-wide level while 6% report adoption at the department-only level.

Finance, Services and Healthcare lead in adoption of digital workflows (company-wide and departmental).

Transportation/Utilities/Comms., Manufacturing and Retail/Wholesale lag other vertical in adoption of digital workflows (departmental and company-wide).

Drives A Secure Print And Document Infrastructure

Managed Print Services – Driving A Secure Print/Document Environment



Your MPS provider should ensure the following:

- MFPs have secure access to network resources and corporate databases for both employees and visitors
 - Authentication and authorization via PIN, biometric card, proximity card, etc.
- MFPs support secure print, encryption, hard disk erase, audit trails
- Document retention policy compliance
 - E.g. medical and financial documents

 Drives An Environmentally Sustainable Print And Document Infrastructure

Managed Print Services -Driving Environmental Sustainability



A right-sized imaging and printing fleet and a less-paper environment reduce your carbon footprint.

- Fewer devices use less energy (if right-sizing is done well).
- Shipping/transporting/mailing costs (e.g., devices, paper, documents, etc.) are reduced.
- Need for office and off-site facilities to store paper documents is reduced.
- Informed, trained, motivated endusers print more responsibly.



Managed Print Services – Driving Environmental Sustainability



Carbon Footprint Lever	Adoption	Impact
Duplex print Outplex print	Moderate -High	50% paper reduction saves 60M trees/year & 11B-53B gallons of water
Lower energy devices and toner	Low	10% less energy saves 576M KW/year
Auto power-down	Low	10% less energy saves 576 KW/year
Recycling cartridges	Moderate	10% more recycling reduces landfills by 1.2B pounds/year
Cloud for document storage & document accounting	Low	Mild-moderate paper reduction
Customer goodwill and loyalty	High	Priceless!

Managed Print Services – Maintaining An Optimized Environment



- Establish effective policies and procedures
 - Requires change management expertise to understand stakeholder motivators
 - Personal vs. departmental vs. corporate needs/benefits
 - Financial benefits
 - Productivity benefits (e.g. employee's quality of life vs. the organization's benefits)
 - Age-specific motivators (e.g. green/sustainability)
- Educate, train employees
 - Institute formal approval policies and procedures (e.g. hardcopy purchases; print procurement)
 - MFP advances (duplex, scan workflows, web access, secure print/hold, secure access, wireless print, etc.)


Managed Print Services – Maintaining An Optimized Environment



- Enforce policies and motivate with rewards
 - Use dashboard to measure progress
 - System alerts for good and bad behaviors
 - When policies are broken, repercussions
 - When behavior advances goals, reward employees and departments
 - Earn points and use them for rewards



(% citing 4 or 5 on scale: 1=No influence at all 5=Very high influence)




1000+ employee companies – provider's experience and provider's financial stability have a slight edge over other factors.

(% respondents)




1000+ employee companies - Best SLAs and highest cost savings are most important.
